**Reviews from Other Campers:** 1) We (Camping With A View) visited this campground in late November, 2006. Both Brookchar and Cutthroat campgrounds overlook Big Lake with views of mountains in the distance. Camp sites are nicely spaced on a hillside with most sites having a view of both the lake and the mountains. While Brookchar is for tents only, Cutthroat campground (a short distance from Brookchar) accomodates both tents and RV's. Most all of the sites at Cutthroat also have views of the lake (with a view of mountains in the distance) and some have views of a large meadow as well. 2.) The following excerpts are from a campground description found in the "U.S. National Forest Campground Guide" web site (<http://www.forestcamping.com/index.htm>) : "...Campground is one of four in the Big Lake Recreation Area. It is located above Big Lake on the east shore ... The sites are well separated with some overlooking the lake while others overlook a large meadow. There are interpretive programs and guided nature walks, usually provided from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Wildlife viewing of elk, deer, antelope and turkey is an attraction of the campground and area. There is a store on the lake with limited groceries, regular unleaded gas, bait and boat rentals (power - 4 and 6hp and row boats). Firewood is available..."
