**Reviews from Other Campers:** 1) The following excerpts are from a campground description found in the "U.S. National Forest Campground Guide" web site (<http://www.forestcamping.com/index.htm>) : "...The campground has two loops along the banks of Stanislaus River's South Fork. The camp sites are located on Giant sequoia (hand-planted) dotted grass meadows or tucked in among Ponderosa pines and cedars in lush glades. This is a pretty campground because of the way camp sites are integrated into the landscape. The campground has a lot of history dating back to the time this area was a Mi-Wok summer camp. In 1905, Mr. Fraser sold the land to Stand Lumber Company who used this piece of flat land for a logging camp. Evidence of the campground's history can be seen in the old railroad bridge supports...The parking aprons are paved..."
