Reviews from Other Campers: 1) The following excerpts are from a campground description found in the "U.S. National Forest Campground Guide" web site (<http://www.forestcamping.com/index.htm>) : "...The campground is heavily wooded with pine and hardwoods. There are deep gullies caused by erosion which actually add character to the campground. During early and mid-April, dogwoods bloom in abundance in the campground. Campers interested in Civil War history will enjoy visiting Holly Springs. Because this antebellum town was spared destruction during the Civil War, there are over 200 buildings listed on the National Register of Historic Places. During April of each year, there is the annual Holly Springs Pilgrimage. This event concentrates on tours of the historic homes and churches and a candlelight dinner. ...Parking aprons are grass and pea gravel...Chewalla Lake is 260 acres. No-wake lake. Beach is sandy..."
