Reviews from Other Campers: 1) We (Camping With A View) visited this campground in late November, 2006. The roads to the campground are rustic and rough for much of the way but the scenery on the way is spectacular. The campground is very remote and very quiet. Most of the camp sites overlook a large beautiful grassy open meadow with an evergreen forest in the background. The ground is strewn with pine needles, pine cones, and small pinkish white quartz rocks and black lava rocks. Because of the remoteness of the location, silence is pervasive and enhances the beauty of the scenery. 2) The following excerpts are from a campground description found in the "**U.S. National Forest Campground Guide**" web site (<http://www.forestcamping.com/index.htm>) : "...The campground, pack it in, pack it out [what you take in, you take out], is located at the end of a scenic drive beside a very pretty meadow among Ponderosa pine, Douglas fir and aspen. The campground name is old Spanish name meaning "round spring." The adjacent meadow features a meandering stream which attracts a variety of wild life...Parallel parking aprons are gravel..."
