The Rio Chama is floatable with some sites overlooking the river. The canyon has been occupied by different cultures since 9500 BC. Contact the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) on (505) 761-8700 for information on the river and licensed outfitters. Multi-colored canyon walls tower some 2,000 feet above the river in places and provide breathtaking vistas throughout the campground."
