**Reviews from Other Campers:** **1)** We (Camping With A View) visited this campground in late November, 2006. The campground is located in a grassy high mountain valley/meadow. Most all of the sites overlook the meadow from its outer edges or are located in the middle of the meadow. The campground is surrounded by the rising sides of the valley/meadow so that you can't see the surrounding mountains. Unfortunately, the day of our visit was overcast and the photos we took don't reflect very well the beauty of the campground. Camp sites are well spaced providing fair to good privacy. **2)** The following excerpts are from a review found in the "**U.S. National Forest Campground Guide**" web site (<http://www.forestcamping.com/index.htm>) : "...The campground is located along a grassy valley cradled between Douglas fir, Ponderosa and Aspen-covered mountain sides. The scent of Ponderosa pine fills the area. This is a very pretty, rustic campground with an abundance of walk-in tent sites... This is bear country. Practice safe food storage techniques...The parking aprons are dirt..."
