**Reviews from Other Campers:** **1)** We (Camping With A View) visited this campground in late November, 2006. Three Rivers campground is very remote and quiet. The camp sites are very well laid out and well spaced with many having ramadas and picnic tables. Most of the sites have excellent views of the surrounding mountains and White Mountains Wilderness area. Although the surrounding landscape is arid, there is a lot of greenery. A river runs along the edge of the campground and can be heard from some of the camp sites. None of the sites have a view of the river. This is a very nice, well planned campground with very beautiful views. **2)** The following excerpts are from a review found in the "U.S. National Forest Campground Guide" web site (<http://www.forestcamping.com/index.htm>): "...The campground, ... provides gorgeous (close-up) views of the Sacramento Mountain range and White Mountain Wilderness.... Although the sites are all in an open area, some have ramadas covering the picnic tables. Horses are permitted in the campground but must be housed in the several provided corrals. Located on the west side of the White Mountain Wilderness, the campground is an excellent home base to explore the mountains and wilderness. ...This is bear country. Practice safe food storage techniques...The parking aprons are gravel..."
