**Beautiful View: River, Desert Landscape and Canyon**

Campground sits along the Jemez River's edge with views of the Jemez Canyon in a "forest" of Juniper, Cholla, Prickly Pear cactus and Cottonwoods. **Best Sites:** All sites should have views of the canyon and desert landscape. Some sites also have views of the river. **\*\* See notes in the Introduction.**

Each site has a panoramic view of the multi-colored walls of Jemez Canyon. The campground is conveniently located off State Rt. 4 (Jemez Mountain Trail), a designated scenic route. A wheelchair friendly paved walkway provides easy access for all to the river and bank fishing. Several sites have ramada-like structures. The campground is well laid out and is almost as attractive as the view. Several day trips should be considered, such as Jemez Springs Bathhouse, Jemez Pueblo, Jemez State Monument and others...The parking aprons are paved..."
