Reviews from Other Campers: 1) The following excerpts are from a campground description found in the "U.S. National Forest Campground Guide" web site (<http://www.forestcamping.com/index.htm>) : "...The campground is composed of five loops (only A, B and C are identified). Some camping sites overlook Island Lake, others have a view of large alpine meadow and still others are tucked into a dense wooded area. Although not close to the Absaroka-Beartooth Wilderness, its glacier-studded peaks provide a spectacular vista from the campground. This is an excellent campground for the whole family with its trails, water sports, vistas and mosquitoes - bring lots of repellent. Day trips include a drive up to Beartooth Pass, Clay Butte Fire Tower (for some great vistas) and the Yellowstone National Park. The drive along the Chief Joseph Scenic Byway is gorgeous with many vistas. Parts of it trace the flight or retreat of the Nez Perce Indians...This is grizzly bear country; practice safe food storage techniques...The parking aprons are gravel...Island Lake is 75 acres..."

From Cody, WY take state route 120 west about 15 1/2 miles to State Rt. 296. Turn left onto Rt. 296 (Chief Joseph Scenic Byway) and go about 46 1/2 miles to US Rt. 212 (Beartooth Scenic Byway). Turn right onto Rt. 212 and go about 12 1/2 miles and follow signs to campground.
